

The City of Ottawa and the Greenspace Watch agree to the following:


1. The Greenspace Watch will withdraw from the Ontario Municipal Board hearing their complaint of the manner in which public written and oral submissions are reflected in Ottawa City Council decisions to implement Bill 73, Smart Growth for Our Communities Act, 2015 ("Bill 73").
2. The Greenspace Watch will refrain from appealing decisions of the Council of the City of Ottawa to enact zoning by-laws or adopt official plan amendments on the basis of issues related to the manner in which public written and oral submissions are reflected in Ottawa City Council decisions to implement Bill 73 for the balance of the present term of Council, which ends in 2018.
3. The City of Ottawa will consult with the Greenspace Watch and other interested stakeholders as to how to better reflect public written and oral submissions in Ottawa City Council decisions in accordance with the requirements of Bill 73.
4. The consultations with the Greenspace Watch and other interested stakeholders will occur during, at the City's option, focused Bill 73 consultations or during the process leading up to the Governance 2018 report, whichever is earliest.
