Re. Response to Canada's Policy for Radioactive Waste and Decommissioning (2023)
Government of Canada Role in Developing the Radioactive Waste Management Strategy

Over 100 civil society organizations have signed letters sent to you since the November 2020 launch of the review of Canada's radioactive waste policy framework, setting out expectations for a sound, comprehensive and responsible waste policy. On specific points, such as the need for an independent, arm's length oversight body, and a ban on the extraction of plutonium from nuclear fuel waste, you have received thousands of communications. Hundreds of Canadians and Canadian organizations contributed extensively to the radioactive waste policy review.

Radioactive Waste Policy

We write today to express our profound disappointment in <u>Canada's Policy for Radioactive Waste and Decommissioning</u> (the Policy) released on March 31st. We urge you – despite our disappointment – to engage again with Canadians in the establishment of a detailed strategy for radioactive waste management in Canada.

Canada's <u>new policy</u> leaves the nuclear industry in charge and the public and the environment at risk. Key priorities were omitted, including the establishment of a national oversight body, a ban on the reprocessing of nuclear fuel waste to extract plutonium, and a commitment to keep radioactive waste isolated from the biosphere.

Radioactive Waste Strategies

On February 8, 2021, 100 civil society organizations wrote expressing our strong concern and disagreement with NRCan's decision to ask the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) to lead the development of an "integrated strategy for radioactive waste". In that letter, we set out our expectations for the review of Canada's radioactive waste policies and the development of radioactive waste management strategies.

Minister O'Regan was clear that the product of the NWMO's exercise was to be provided for <u>review</u> and <u>consideration</u> by the <u>Government</u>. We fully understand and accept industry having input into Canada's radioactive waste management strategy; we fully reject any notion that industry <u>determines</u> the strategy. That is the work of Government.

On July 4th the NWMO <u>announced</u> that it had submitted to you its "<u>recommendations</u>" for an Integrated Strategy for Radioactive Waste. Further to the commitments made by the office of the Minister of Natural Resources, we now await your invitation to dialogue on this important matter.

We urge you to ensure the full engagement of the Canadian public and Indigenous peoples with the Government in developing Canada's strategy for radioactive waste management.

Thank you for your consideration. We await your reply with positive expectations.
